

show will be as sight to behold as long as the Band doesn't dress up as the Invisible Woman.






Game 6: Friday, February 17th, 2012 vs. Harvard University at 7pm EST: Let's give a cheer.







Game 1: Saturday, April 28th 2012 vs. Cornell University Women's La-





A Message from the President of the Brown Band

Dear alumni,

Hello! My name is Lena Barsky, I'm sophomore studying classics (specifically Latin) as well as political science, and I'm the current President of the Brown Band. I was Corresponding Secretary last year, and I've had the great pleasure of meeting and corresponding with many of you already. What I haven't been able to do yet is address just what a huge impact you all as alums have on the Band so here I am, writing in the Alumni Newsletter! Pretty exciting, huh? I think so.

More exciting than my writing a letter to all of you is the fact that we as an organization have been incredibly lucky, donation-wise, this past year. As you may or may not know, the Undergraduate Finance Board was not kind to us when we submitted our budget. We underwent not one, but *two* appeals processes (and apparently were one of the few organizations to ever try for a second appeal) and still came up rather short of our goals. The Band was worried: our size has increased in the past couple years, and in this economy the costs of running an organization like the Brown Band certainly aren't getting any lower. However, thanks to our fantastic--and extremely generous--network of alumni, we were able to make up most of what we had lost through your donations.

Our phone-a-thon in February raised considerably more than in previous years, and this money enabled the Band to buy new equipment for percussionists. They were very pleased with their drum heads, stands, and sticks that were, for once, not held together by tape! The phone-a-thon funds also enabled us to make much-needed repairs to instruments from clarinets to tubas and everything in between, and we even bought a new flute, which came in handy this fall when a whole slew of new freshmen joined the flute section. We as a Band were ecstatic, and felt fortunate to have such a large amount of support from our alums.

But wait, it gets better! Even after the Phrighteningly Phinancially-Successful Phone-a-thon (see what I did there?), we as a Band found ourselves without the funding to go on three of our four away trips for the fall Football Season--Cornell, Columbia, and Yale. Curse you, UFB! Just when things were looking dire, we received three anonymous donations (or, as I called them, three extremely-well-timed gifts from whatever deity is looking out for the Band) that fully funded the travel expenses for these trips. We were floored and couldn't have felt more loved. We did, in fact, go to all three of those games as well as the night game at Harvard. Thanks to your magnanimity, we were able to continue to support the football team.

Aside from these two major fundraising windfalls, we have received generous donations from our alums throughout the year and, thanks to your support, are able to continue purchasing necessary supplies, making instrument repairs, etc. that we would not have been able to do using solely UFB-provided funds. We have to start the budget process again soon, though, so keep your fingers crossed!

In all seriousness, though, I *cannot* stress enough what a profound impact you all have as Alumni of the Brown Band. It is because of your donations that we have been able to travel, buy supplies, allow anyone who wants to do so to join the Band, and maintain the standard of excellence (and bawdiness) that we're known for. As Brandon, Carrie, and Lewie have already said, your presence at games and continued interest in the band is invaluable, and I wholeheartedly second that motion.
