A: Seeing each other's lovely faces again, not on a Zoom screen!


B: Visiting the beautiful countryside of Ithaca, complete with a zombified field show with plenty of wailing, screaming, moaning, and dying



upon in our pregame and halftime shows. But alas, a better Band does not a better football team make.


Brown (0) vs. St. John's (1)


